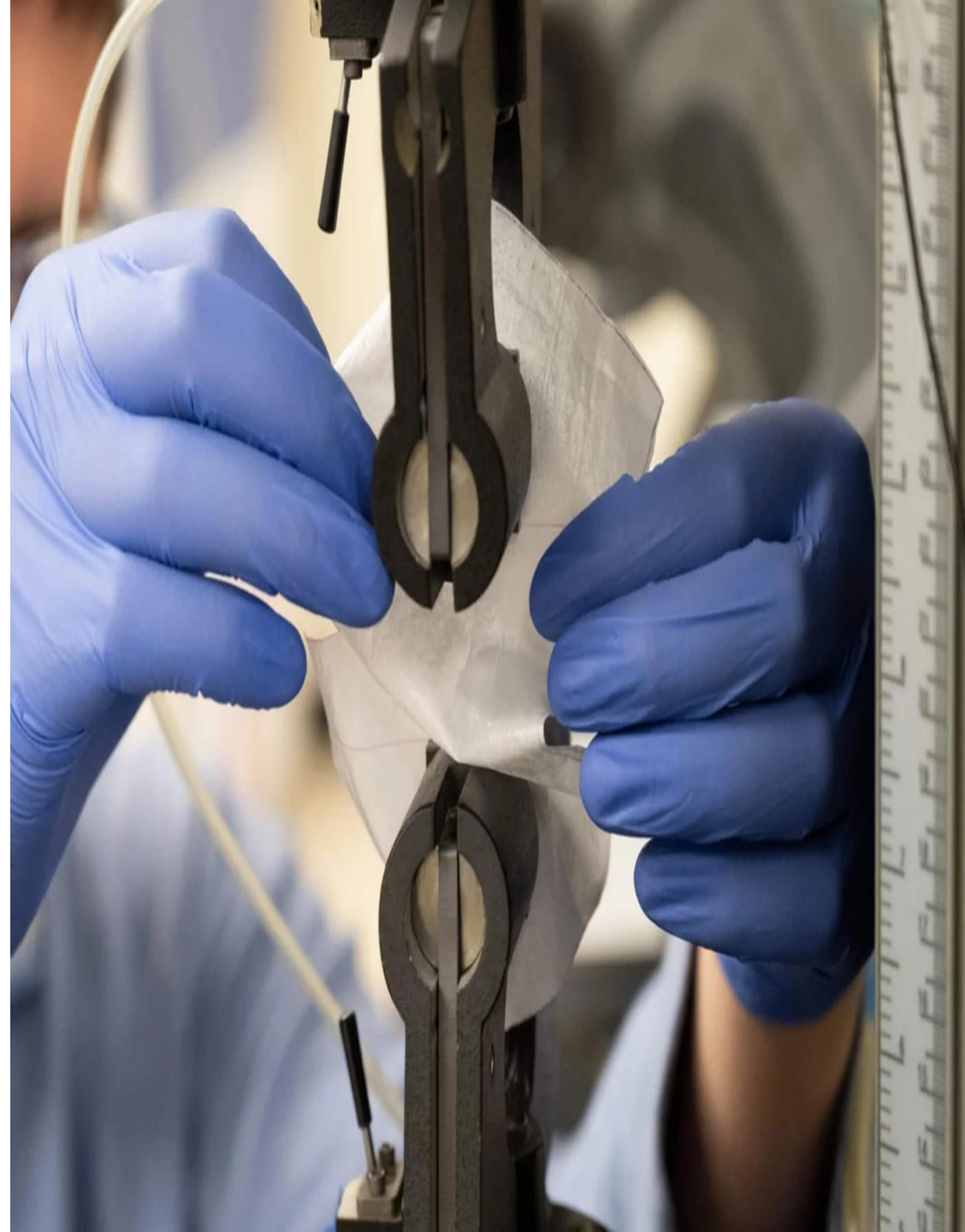

How is LDI Advancing Safer Chemicals in Products?

Our **Sustainability Action Plan** sets a standard for how we avoid the use of toxic chemicals and continue to develop new product platforms and sustainable workflows.

- Target phase out of specific materials focused on the most hazardous polymers first.
- Ban classes of chemicals of concern.
- Provide industry-specific material content disclosure forms and/or test results.
- Consider 3rd party certifications
- Invest in R&D with an emphasis on product longevity and minimizing waste. Cautious approach with biodegradable and recycled content.

LDI Interiors Successes

- Material phase out
 - PVC-Free (no vinyl)
- Ban classes of chemicals of concerns
 - Flame Retardant-Free: California AB-2998 Compliant
 - PFAS-Free (no PFC'S)
 - Antimicrobial-Free (no biocides)
- Material content disclosure forms & test results
 - Health Product Declarations (HPD's)
 - Participate in Mindful Materials Common Materials Framework
 - Initial focus - Human Health
 - LEED criteria
 - (IAQ) Low VOC emissions: California 01350 Compliant

 - Participate in Mindful Materials Common Materials Framework
 - Next focus area - Social Health & Equity



- 3rd Party certifications
 - Greenscreen certification
 - In process



Growing Demand/Expanding Availability

- Incumbent technology creates tremendous noise/confusion
 - Everyone thinks they are a chemist
 - Keep terminology as close to the polymer and chemical class level as you can.
- Purchasing driven by bids built on low-cost model
 - Establish performance standards, ban polymers/chemical classes, keep the low-cost model.
 - Allowing separate contracts for a PVC version and a PVC-Free version slows progress.
- List and certification overload
 - 3rd party certifications are expensive and can be misleading.
 - There are too many different lists to manage.
